

A History of the Plymouth and Shiloh FFA Chapter's

1920's

1923-1924: According to the 1924 Shiloh annual The Smith-Hughes Department of Agriculture was given final approval by the State upon installation of proper equipment, and was ready for class work at the opening of the 1923-1924 school year. The instructor was J. H. Bacon. Classes in Farm Shop, Animal Husbandry, and Farm Crops were organized for boys in the first three years of High School.

A department requirement was that each boy must do some practical work in connection with his class work, carrying a home project in which he has financial interest. Projects during the 1923-1924 school year ranged from feeding hops and raising baby chicks to growing an acre of potatoes.

The boys of the Farm Crops Section took over the management of a seventy tree apple orchard and expected to have a high class product as a result of proper pruning, spraying, and packing fruit. During the winter they visited many stock, dairy and general farms in the county who gave talks and demonstrated good farming methods. A grain show and auction was held at the Farmer's Institute. Farmers meetings in regard to lime and fertilizers were held for local farmers who bought lime as a result of the meeting.

One of the outstanding events of the year was the department banquet put on by the Home Economics and Smith-Hughes boys and girls. The policy of the Smith-Hughes Department of Agriculture is to second the efforts of the school board and superintendent to give Shiloh best possible school system and to be a live part of that system.

1924-1925: According to the Richland County Annual, Shiloh Agriculture at Shiloh High School received Federal Aid according to the provisions of the Smith-Hughes law. Classes were in farm shop, animal industry, farm crops, and engineering.

A division of the Smith-Hughes idea provides for a program of short course and part time work intended for men engaged in the business of fanning. Short course work consisted of three weeks of tractor, soils and fertilizer, and poultry schools. Poultry culling demonstration and orchard pruning are also part of this work.

A Fanners' Independent Institute was held on January 19-20 with a poultry exhibit and vegetable show. A program of speakers on live questions of the day and entertainment by the village and township schools made this a very successful institute.

1926-1927: According to the Shiloh annual, The Smith-Hughes Department had accomplished good results. The graduating class of 1927 had the first boy to have completed the course. the different classes had taken up many different projects during the year. Courses in Farm Crops, Agricultural Engineering, and Shops were offered.

A county contest in stock judging was started last year and has been continued this year. Teams from the different Smith-Hughes clubs in the county participate. the schools having departments were: Madison Township, Lucas, Lexington and Shiloh. The winning team each year was awarded a silver trophy cup to be a permanent possession for the school. So far Shiloh has the only leading team with almost a 100 point lead with only two classes of cattle and horses left to judge, Shiloh has hopes of winning the cup this year.

Plans are under way for a special display of the Smith Hughes work at the County Fair this fall. this will include a combined display of work by all the departments of the county and also a competitive display of shop work for which it is hoped the fair Board will donate some worth while prizes.

1927-1928: According to the Shiloh annual, the Smith-Hughes Department of Agriculture consisted of three double period classes. Subjects that were given in the department were Farm Crops, Soils and Farm Management and Farm Shops. The crops had a very successful year. In the fall field trips were taken to various demonstrations in the county. In the winter when weather did not permit travel time was devoted to hard study.

In the spring the class drew up contracts with the A. McBride and the school board for the handling of McBride's orchard from March 1, 1928-December 1, 1928. The fall and spring of the year was devoted to treating sheep for farmers of Cass Township. In order to earn credit in Farm Crops the students must carry out a farm project. They must draw up a contract with his father for the use of machinery and team, and must do the work himself or pay for the work done by others.

The shops class consisted of Freshman, they did very good work bettering the school and playgrounds. They constructed the swings which the P. T. A. donated to the school and also made bookracks and several other useful articles for rooms, some of which were taken by the students. The Soil and Fann Management class had many interesting trips during the school year chiefly to the farm of the students to do soil testing and surveying. Several trips were taken to Mansfield to the Isaly dairy plant and other places of interest. The trip of the year was taken by the entire department to Cleveland on April 13.

During the year, two short courses in agriculture were given by the Smith-Hughes department teacher to benefit the farmers of Cass township. The Junior course was given for farmers between the ages of 18-33 and the senior course was given for the elder farmers 23 and up. The courses were well attended and greatly appreciated by the farmers.

1930's

1930's

In 1931 Tom Kranz's father drove a model-A bus (that had a wooden floor) and as a junior in high school picked students up for school. In 1932 this was no longer allowed.

January 23, 1933 is when the Shiloh Chapter F.F.A was chartered. The original charter was lost and a second copy was received on November 5, 1935.

In 1937 Periscope Jesse Wayne Hamman indicated he wanted to be an agricultural teacher, but he was needed on the farm and then due to the draft he entered the Navy on the Battle Ship USS Alabama in WWII.

1940's

1950's

Gideon Deming Seymour started teaching Agriculture in Shiloh in 1951 and taught 5 years until 1956. He married Elizabeth Grace Peterson from Dayton, Ohio on June 14 1947. Before teaching in Shiloh he taught Agriculture in Preble County at Dixon and Lanier. He lived in Eaton and she lived in Dayton and she said they "ate in Eaton and dated in Dayton".
